INTERNAL REGULATIONS OF THE ASSOCIATION

Practical arrangements for implementing the Statutes

English translation for information. The French text remains the authoritative version.

These Internal Regulations specify the practical arrangements for implementing the Statutes. They may neither amend nor contradict them.

Article 1 - Purpose and Hierarchy of Rules

These Internal Regulations specify the day-to-day rules governing operation, membership, participation, discipline, moderation, the organisation of consultations, access to facilities and the implementation of editorial procedures. In the event of conflict, the Statutes prevail.

Article 2 - Membership, Renewal and Membership Card

Membership is registered after acceptance of the conditions laid down in the Statutes and payment of the membership fee. The digital card bears an individual number. Membership is renewed annually. The Association determines payment arrangements and the retention of membership data in accordance with applicable law.

Article 3 - Premium Membership

Premium membership is offered for one year at a fee of 150 euros, subject to the provisions of Article 2 of the Statutes. Its benefits relate to participation and services; they do not create any additional voting right. Participation in the Disciplinary Council remains subject to the composition and impartiality rules set out below.

Article 4 - Notices and General Meetings

Notices state the date, time, place or connection link, agenda and, where necessary, the documents submitted for a vote. Remote voting uses a process which, as far as possible, identifies voters, prevents duplicate votes and retains a record of the result.

Proxies are collected before or at the beginning of the meeting. A member may not hold more than two proxies unless a specific rule in the Statutes provides otherwise. Minutes are drawn up and retained in accordance with the Statutes.

Article 5 - Mixed-sex and Single-sex Consultations

Before opening, each consultation states its purpose, intended participants, period, method of participation and intended use of the results. A men-only consultation must be justified by its subject of study or expression of male experience. It does not constitute a general exclusion of women from the life of the Association.

Where scientifically or documentarily relevant, the results of mixed-sex and single-sex consultations may be compared. Results are presented together with their methodological limitations and are not presented as representative of all men or women without appropriate statistical justification.

Article 6 - Procedure for the Inclusion, Exclusion and Reinstatement of Entries

Every proposal to create, substantially amend, exclude or reinstate an entry is recorded. The file may include the reason, sources, arguments for and against and, where the system permits, the results of ratings and comments.

The editorial direction examines whether the proposal complies with the Editorial Charter. Where the Regulations or Charter provide for a consultation or vote, it is organised according to the announced arrangements. The final decision is published with an appropriate level of traceability, without disclosing personal or confidential data.

Article 7 - Comments, Moderation and Reports

Comments must respect the principles of non-violence, respect for persons, intellectual seriousness and adversarial debate. Moderated content includes, in particular, threats, incitement to violence, harassment, doxxing, statements intended to intimidate, manifestly defamatory content and content contrary to law.

Moderation may delete, hide or suspend content and may temporarily restrict an account's participation where necessary. Disciplinary measures concerning members are taken under the statutory and disciplinary procedure, not by a simple technical moderation decision.

Article 8 - Disciplinary Council

The Disciplinary Council is composed of members appointed in accordance with procedures determined by the General Meeting or, for its first composition, by the Founder-President. Any person directly concerned by proceedings must refrain from participating in the decision where their impartiality may reasonably be questioned.

Except in an emergency requiring an interim measure, the member concerned receives notice of the allegations and has a reasonable period in which to submit observations. The Council decides by a majority of members present or validly participating remotely, subject to a quorum of half its members. If there is no quorum, a new meeting may decide with the members present, unless otherwise provided.

Article 9 - Library, Workspace, Garden, Auditorium and Bookshop

Access to facilities is subject to their opening hours, capacity and safety rules. The physical library is a reference and study space without lending, unless a later decision provides otherwise. Auditorium events may be free of charge or subject to payment. The garden is a space for calm and reflection. Bookshop sales are allocated to financing the Association's purpose.

Article 10 - Record Retention and Transparency

Association documents, voting results, editorial histories and archived versions are retained under arrangements that ensure their integrity. External publication is limited to information compatible with data protection, confidentiality and security.

Article 11 - Adoption and Amendment

These Internal Regulations are adopted by the competent body in accordance with the Statutes. Any amendment is brought to the attention of members. No provision of the Internal Regulations may be interpreted as amending the Statutes.
